Important Notes

- This insert has the **Materials** list, **Cutting** instructions, and **Borders** instructions necessary for making the “Garden Twist” quilt using fabric from the *Garden Twist Anniversary Collection*. This insert has information for two different quilt sizes (Crib/Lap and Queen/King). Please make sure you are on the right page, before purchasing and/or cutting materials for your quilt!
- You will need a copy of the *Garden Twist Quilts* booklet for the complete quilt-assembly instructions.

CRIB/LAP QUILT

FINISHED SIZE: 58" x 68"

Materials

Yardage requirements are based on 40" fabric width.

- 2¼ yds. Floral Bouquet (1GT3) for A and C squares
- 1 yd. Light Trellis (4GT3) for B, D, and E pieces, and inner border
- 1¼ yds. Dark Trellis (4GT33) for B, D, and E pieces, and binding
- ⅞ yd. White-on-White (12GT1) for F and G pieces
- 2⅞ yds. Floral Swag (10GT3) for outer border (Yardage is generous to allow for selective cutting.)
- 4 yds. for backing (widthwise seam)

Cutting

Cut strips across width of fabric, unless otherwise instructed.

From Floral Bouquet, selectively cut:

- 20 squares, 7½" x 7½", for A squares (**Important:** Be sure to see Selective Cutting instructions on page 3 of the *Garden Twist Quilts* booklet. Then follow chart at bottom of page 4 to cut A squares.)
- 12 squares, 4" x 4", for C squares (**Important:** Be sure to see Selective Cutting instructions on page 3 of the *Garden Twist Quilts* booklet. Then follow chart at bottom of page 4 to cut C squares.)

From Light Trellis, cut:

- 5 strips, 1½" x 40", for inner border
- 3 strips, 2¼" x 40"; subcut 37 squares, 2¼" x 2¼", for B squares
- 3 strips, 2¼" x 40"; subcut 18 rectangles, 2¼" x 5¾", for D rectangles
- 1 strip, 2¼" x 40", subcut 6 rectangles, 2¼" x 4", for E rectangles

From Dark Trellis, cut:

- 7 strips, 2½" x 40", for double-fold binding
- 3 strips, 2¼" x 40"; subcut 37 squares, 2¼" x 2¼", for B squares
- 3 strips, 2¼" x 40"; subcut 18 rectangles, 2¼" x 5¾", for D rectangles
- 1 strip, 2¼" x 40", subcut 6 rectangles, 2¼" x 4", for E rectangles

From White-on-White, cut:

- 4 squares, 11¼" x 11¼"; cut each square twice diagonally to make 16 of triangle F (2 extra)
- 2 squares, 5⅞" x 5⅞"; cut each square once diagonally to make 4 of triangle G

From Floral Swag, selectively cut:

- 4 strips, 8½" x length of fabric, for outer border (Cut border strips so that each strip is centered over the swag design.)

Borders

Follow instructions on pages 7-8 of “Garden Twist Quilts” to make the center of your quilt top. When you reach the borders, use the instructions here, rather than those in the book.

1. Sew Light Trellis 1½" x 40" inner border strips together, end-to-end, to make one long strip. Press seams open.
2. Measure length of quilt top through center. From the long strip, cut 2 inner border strips to this measurement, and sew to sides of quilt. Press seams toward inner borders.
3. Measure width of quilt top, including borders just added, through center. From the long strip, cut 2 inner border strips to this measurement, and sew to top and bottom of quilt. Press seams toward inner borders.
4. Study the photograph for placement of the Floral Swag outer border strips. You might want to work on a design wall, adjusting the placement of the four outer borders until you are happy with the way the floral swag design meets at the corners (remember that the corners will be mitered).
5. With right sides together, pin border strips to sides of quilt top (border strips will extend beyond top and bottom of quilt; it's easiest if you start pinning at the center of border and work outward). Sew border strips to sides of quilt top, beginning and ending ¼" from raw edges of quilt. Backstitch to secure. Press seams toward borders. Now sew the top and bottom borders to the quilt top; start and stop your seams at the point where the side borders join the quilt (¼" from edges). Backstitch to secure. Press seams toward borders.
6. Miter corners using your favorite technique.

QUEEN/KING QUILT

FINISHED SIZE: 88" x 108"

Materials

Yardage requirements are based on 40" fabric width.

4½ yds. Floral Bouquet (1GT3) for A and C squares

2¼ yds. Light Trellis (4GT3) for B, D, and E pieces, and inner border

2⅞ yds. Dark Trellis (4GT33) for B, D, and E pieces, and binding

1¼ yds. White-on-White (12GT1) for F and G pieces

3⅞ yds. Floral Swag (10GT3) for outer border (Yardage is generous to allow for selective cutting.)

8½ yds. for backing (widthwise seams)

Cutting

Cut strips across width of fabric, unless otherwise instructed.

From Floral Bouquet, selectively cut:

- 63 squares, 7½" x 7½", for A squares (**Important:** Be sure to read Selective Cutting instructions on page 3 of the *Garden Twist Quilts* booklet. Then follow chart at bottom of page 6 to cut A squares.)
- 48 squares, 4" x 4", for C squares (**Important:** Be sure to read Selective Cutting instructions on page 3 of the *Garden Twist Quilts* booklet. Then follow chart at bottom of page 6 to cut C squares.)

From Light Trellis, cut:

- 9 strips, 1½" x 40", for inner border
- 8 strips, 2¼" x 40"; subcut 134 squares, 2¼" x 2¼", for B squares
- 12 strips, 2¼" x 40"; subcut 72 rectangles, 2¼" x 5¾", for D rectangles
- 3 strips, 2¼" x 40", subcut 24 rectangles, 2¼" x 4", for E rectangles

From Dark Trellis, cut:

- 11 strips, 2½" x 40", for double-fold binding
- 8 strips, 2¼" x 40"; subcut 134 squares, 2¼" x 2¼", for B squares
- 12 strips, 2¼" x 40"; subcut 72 rectangles, 2¼" x 5¾", for D rectangles
- 3 strips, 2¼" x 40", subcut 24 rectangles, 2¼" x 4", for E rectangles

From White-on-White, cut:

- 7 squares, 11¼" x 11¼"; cut each square twice diagonally to make 28 of triangle F
- 2 squares, 5⅞" x 5⅞"; cut each square once diagonally to make 4 of triangle G

From Floral Swag, selectively cut:

- 4 strips, 8½" x length of fabric, for outer border (Cut border strips so that each strip is centered over the swag design.)

Borders

Follow instructions on pages 7-8 of “Garden Twist Quilts” to make the center of your quilt top. When you reach the borders, use the instructions here, rather than those in the book.

1. Sew Light Trellis 1½" x 40" inner border strips together, end-to-end, to make one long strip. Press seams open.
2. Measure length of quilt top through center. From the long strip, cut 2 inner border strips to this measurement, and sew to sides of quilt. Press seams toward inner borders.
3. Measure width of quilt top, including borders just added, through center. From the long strip, cut 2 inner border strips to this measurement, and sew to top and bottom of quilt. Press seams toward inner borders.
4. Study the photograph for placement of the Floral Swag outer border strips. You might want to work on a design wall, adjusting the placement of the four outer borders until you are happy with the way the floral swag design meets at the corners (remember that the corners will be mitered).
5. With right sides together, pin border strips to sides of quilt top (border strips will extend beyond top and bottom of quilt; it's easiest if you start pinning at the center of border and work outward). Sew border strips to sides of quilt top, beginning and ending ¼" from raw edges of quilt. Backstitch to secure. Press seams toward borders. Now sew the top and bottom borders to the quilt top; start and stop your seams at the point where the side borders join the quilt (¼" from edges). Backstitch to secure. Press seams toward borders.
6. Miter corners using your favorite technique.
