

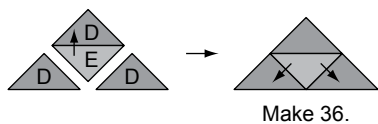

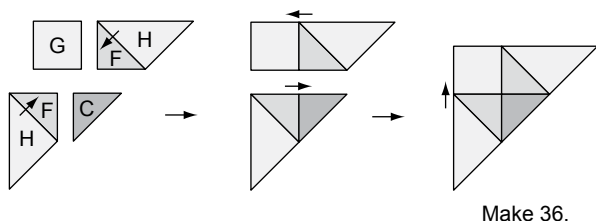

In The Beginning *fabrics*

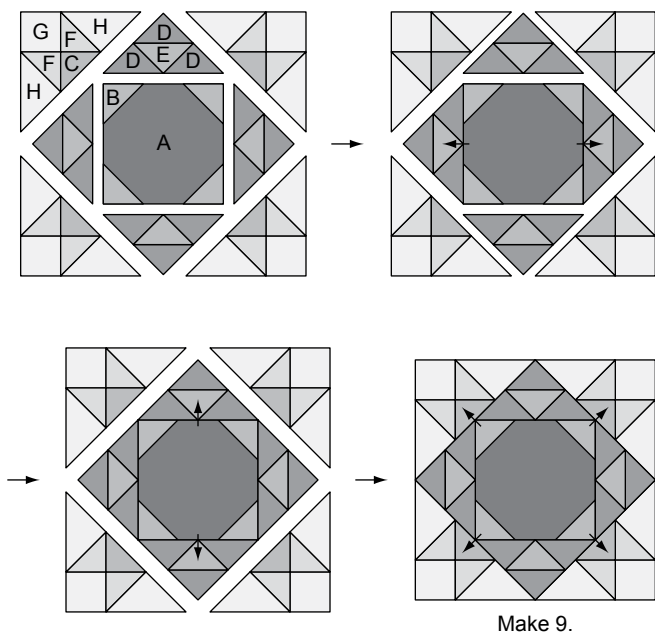
3. Using 3 Red Floral Tonal D triangles, and 1 Red/Gold Cherries E triangle, assemble a D/E triangle unit as shown. Repeat to make a total of 36 units.



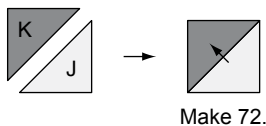
4. Using 1 Red/Gold Cherries C triangle, 2 Green Cherries F triangles, 2 Ivory Floral Tonal H triangles, and 1 Ivory Floral Tonal 2½" G square, assemble a C/F/G/H triangle unit as shown. Repeat to make a total of 36 units.



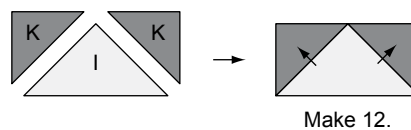
5. Using 1 block-center A/B unit, 4 D/E triangle units, and 4 C/F/G/H triangle units, assemble a block as shown. Repeat to make a total of 9 blocks.



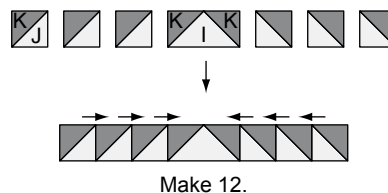
6. Using 1 Green Floral Tonal K triangle, and 1 Ivory Floral Tonal J triangle, assemble a K/J triangle unit as shown. Repeat to make a total of 72 units.



7. Using 2 Green Floral Tonal K triangles, and 1 Ivory Floral Tonal I triangle, assemble a K/I triangle unit as shown. Repeat to make a total of 12 units.

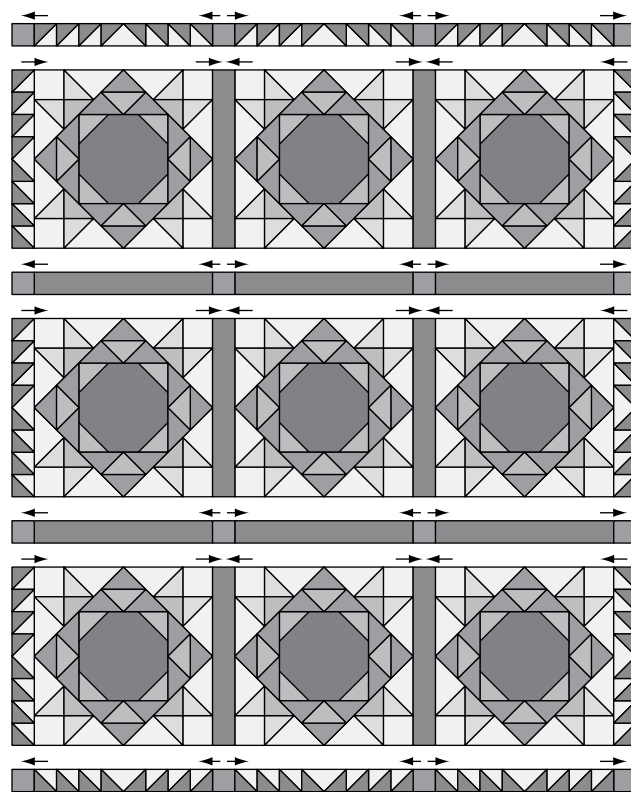


8. Using 6 K/J triangle units, and 1 K/I triangle unit, assemble a triangle sashing unit as shown. Repeat to make a total of 12 units.



Quilt Top Assembly

1. Sew 9 blocks, 12 triangle sashing units, 12 Green Floral Tonal 2" x 12½" sashing rectangles, and 16 Red Floral Tonal 2" sashing squares, together in rows as shown.



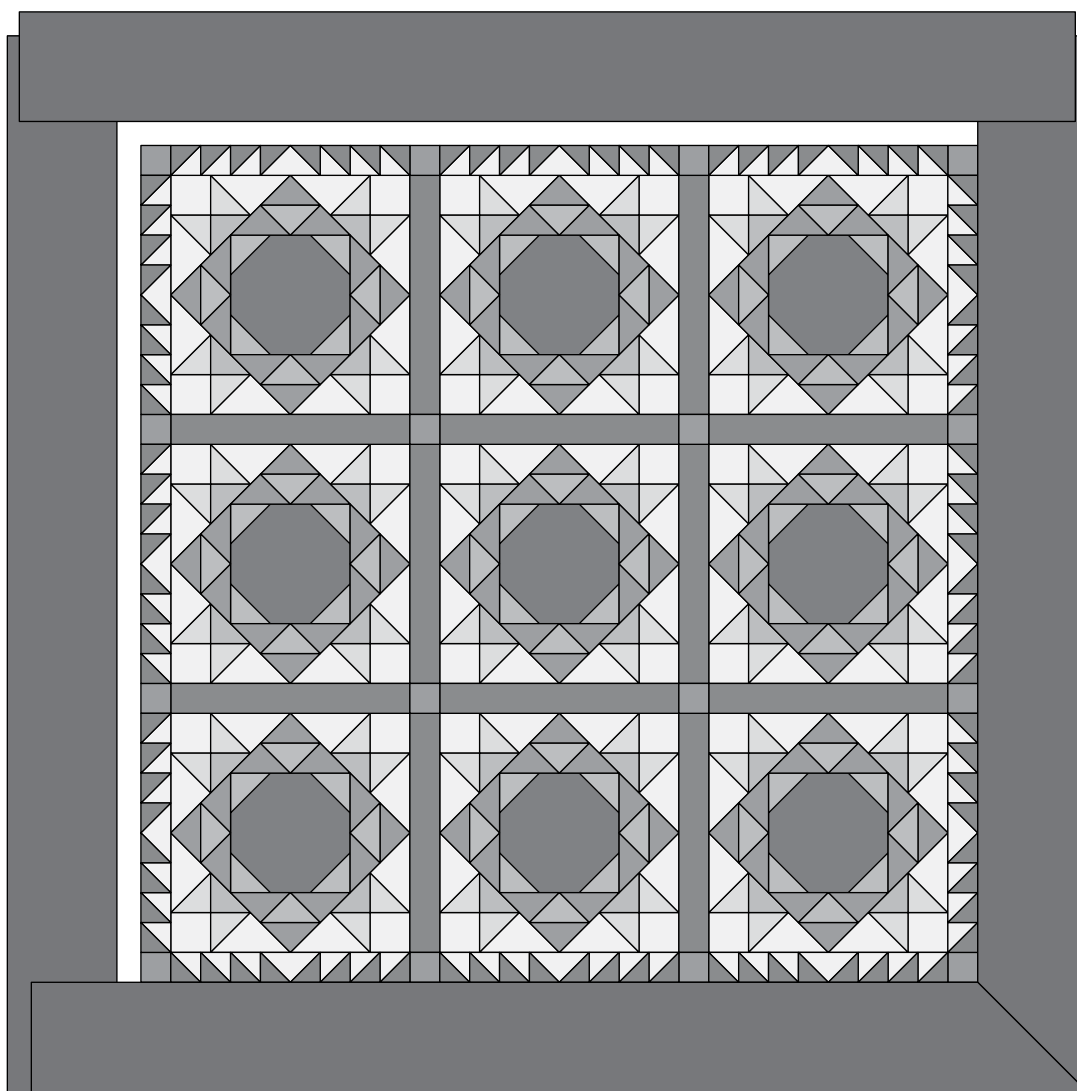
2. Sew rows together as shown in the Quilt Assembly Diagram on the back page. Press seams toward rows with fewest pieces.

Borders

With right sides together (and making sure that the design is oriented correctly, with the red wavy stripe portion of the design at the inner border), pin border strips to sides of quilt top (border strips should extend approximately equally beyond top and bottom of quilt; it's easiest if you start pinning at the center of border and work outward). Sew border strips to sides of quilt top, beginning and ending $\frac{1}{4}$ " from raw edges of quilt. Backstitch to secure. Press seams toward borders. Now sew the top and bottom borders to the quilt top; start and stop your seams at the point where the side borders join the quilt ($\frac{1}{4}$ " from edges). Backstitch to secure. Press seams toward borders. Miter corners using your favorite technique.

Finishing

Layer quilt top, batting, and backing. Quilt as desired. Bind. Don't forget to sign and date your finished quilt.
